

## **ACV Ad 14 Affranchissements for the Priory of Lutry, commissaire Humbert de Mediavilla, 1464.**

This volume records agreements made in 1464 for the process of “affranchissement” and “manumission” of those formerly subject to the “taille” (in effect, serfs) in the jurisdiction of the priory of Lutry. As described in these records, the agreements were made between Nobilis Petrus de Sancto Amore, procuror for the priory, and others, during the tenure of the Prior Dominus Guigo de Rocheta, and individuals whose status was described as “talliabilis” and “condicione manus mortue”. By means of paying a sum of money over a period of three or four years, these individuals were “freed” from this status, but by implication and subsequent history, they still owed the annual “cense” and other obligations of the properties they held as tenants or free subjects of the priory. All items bear the signature and parape of Humbertus de Mediavilla.

These “affranchissements” are frequently mentioned in later terriers for the priory, notably the series of volumes and a summary “rentier” compiled by Petrus Marchiandi 1500-1514 (Ff 32, 32bis, 33, 34, and 35). As there is little additional information, the extracts here provide mainly the names of those who are thereby “liberated”, the date, and the few additional details that may be present.

The volume was originally unnumbered, but there is a modern pagination in pencil. However, the pagination is irregular, several pages remaining unnumbered, and there are blank pages. The volume is apparently incomplete, however, as later citations of the affranchissements include many not found here, notably those dated 04 may 1464, of which several are cited in the surviving fragment of a terrier by Petrus Villiencii, ACV C IX b 1434, dates 1487-1490. The affranchissements are also cited, generally without dates, in the terriers of Petrus Marchiandi noted above. Based on the dates and some folio numbers cited in these sources, Ad 14 is apparently only a small part of the “affranchissements” of 1464.



Page 1 Ansermodus Bersier de Espesses, 14 jun 1464, 20 livres payable over 4 years.

- 1 Petrus Maioris de Lustriaco, 14 jun 1464, 25 sols payable over 3 years.
- 2 Matheus Episcopi saltor sive codurerius Lausanne, 14 jun 1464, 7 livres payable over 4 years.
- 2 Petrus Brichez (or possibly Bruchez), 14 jun 1464, 50 sols payable over 4 years.
- 3 Johannes Chinnyn alias Pinjar de Espesses, 05 jul 1464, 43 livres payable over 4 years, nomine et ex causa pretii et concordie affranchizacionis et manumissionis acque liberacionis

factarum per prefatos dominos administratorem et conventum dicti prioratus Lustriaci factarum dicto Johanni Pinjar et Anthonie eius uxoris filie quondam Symonis Bersier de eorum hereditate bonis, rebus, et possessionibus quamquidem pertinere quantitatem.

(The page after 3, containing the conclusion of the preceding item, is not numbered.)

4 Franciscus Magnyn de Riex morans Culiaci suo et Catherine eius uxoris nominibus, 05 jul 1464, 7 livres “solvendas ut supra”.

5 Jacobus Mocterens de Espesses, 05 jul 1464, 36 livres payable over 4 years.

6 Johannes Platon de Chinaul, 05 jul 1464, 18 livres payable over 4 years.

7 Petrus Gauteir alias Gide de Chinaul, 05 jul 1464, 16 livres, term not stated other than “modo et forma quibus ceteri predecanti”.

8 Anthonius Chalvoz de Curson morans apud Granvaud, 05 jul 1464, 10 livres payable over 4 years.

9 Jaquetus Glory alias Perret de Espesses suo et Francisci Glory alias Perret eius fratris nominibus, 05 jul 1464, 25 livres payable over 4 years.

10 Johanneta Bellonaz uxor Petri Bellon, 05 jul 1464, 24 livres payable “infra terminos predictos cum clausulis opportunis ut ceteri precedenti”. With subscription, Laudavit Petrus Bellon 25 jul 1464 (anno supra), witnesses Ansermodus Bersier et Johannes Ramus in domo dicti Ansermodi, with signature and parape of Humbertus de Mediavilla.

11 Nicodus douz Bos de Chinaul, 05 jul 1464, 20 livres payable over 4 years.

12 Petrus Monthet alias Voyes, 05 jul 1464, 6 livres payable over 4 years.

(The page after 13 is not numbered, the two pages are here designated 13a and 13b.)

13a Petrus de Espiney de Espesses, 05 jul 1464, 22 livres, term not stated except “dictus Petrus solvere promisit et se astrinxit et obligavit modo et forma quibus ceteri precedentis”.

13b Petrus Thoraz alias Chebrez ? de Curson, 05 jul 1464 (datum ut supra), 30 livres payable over 4 years.

14 Jaqueta filia quondam Johannis Berdon de Curson relicta Roleti Carrel, 05 jul 1464, 8 livres payable over 4 years.

15 Anthonius Gerbex de Espesses, 05 jul 1464 (datum ut supra), 36 livres payable over 4 years.

(Blank pages after page 15, the next non-blank page is numbered 27.)

27 Relicta Johannis de Chemrenaul (=Champrenaud) et Glaudio de Chamrenaul dictorum conjugum filius, die Jovis post festum Sancti Bartholomei Apostoli 1464, 9 livres payable over 3 years.

(The back of page 27 is blank and not numbered.)

28 Jaquetus Tornyer burgensis Lustriaci et Mermetus eius filius, die Jovis post festum Decollacionis Sancti Johannis Baptiste 1464, 48 sols payable over 3 years, de rebus quondam Petri dicti Bossenens.

29 Nobilis Petrus de Sancto Amore, lacks date, 20 livres payable over 4 years.

(The page after 29 is unnumbered, containing only the conclusion of the preceding reconnaissance.)

30 Johannes filius Anthonii de Chamrenaul, 03 feb 1464, 10 livres payable over 3 years.

30 Johannes Micho de Cresto prope Espesses, 9 livres payable over 3 years.

31 Petrus Girard de Espesses, die Jovis post Dominicam Bordarum 1464, 12 livres payable, term not stated.

31 Anthonius Grangier alias D... ? (uncertain script) de Curson morans ou Plex, 29 ? (die ultima) feb 1464, 6 livres 10 sols, term not stated.

32 Francesia relictā Hugoneti dou Bos de Chinaul et \_\_\_\_\_ (blank space) medius filius eius, 07 mar 1464, 18 livres payable over 3 years.

32 Thomas Magnyn et Marguereta eius uxor, 07 mar 1464, 60 sols payable over 3 years, certorum bonorum quondam Nicodi de Fle primi viri dicte Marguerete.

33 Jacobus Cavyn ? (uncertain script) de Chinaul, 07 mar 1464, 10 livres payable over 3 years.

33 Anthonius de la Pierraz de Espesses, 01 mar 1464, 20 sols payable over 3 years.

34 Roletus Gerbex et Anthonius (but later in the text, Johannes) Picot de Espesses, 20 mar 1464, 7 livres payable over 3 years.

34 Petrus Bersier (alias Marchian) de Espesses, 20 mar 1464, the amount and term of payment were originally left blank, then "bersier alias marchian" was written in ths blank space instead of the amount to be paid !

35 Johannes de Rippa civis et apothecarius Lausanne, 15 mar 1464, 7 livres payable over 3 years, certain properties que quondam fuerunt de parte filie quondam Johannodi Vionerii de Savuit.

35      Anthonius Maiori de Lustrico, 09 mar 1464, 40 livres payable over 3 years, as a result of inheritance from the late Petrus Bero de Bossenens homo talliabilis dicti prioratus.
