

## **ACV Af 4 Quernets and Reconnaissances for Louis de Cossonay, 1377-1379, commissaire Martinus de Loes.**

In its present state, the volume lacks an original title page and most introductory material. There is one mention of a commissaire Martinus de Loes near the end, but without a clear statement that he was in fact responsible for the entire volume. Also, p. 143, a subscription, “Per me Martinus de Loes notarius qui predicta omnia et singula suprascripta recepi”. Additional evidence for the identity of the commissaire and the purpose of the volume can be gleaned from marginal notations and the labels of the much later répertoires.

The sources of this additional information are not clear, unless from knowledge passed down by generations of notaries, and perhaps also derived from original flyleaves and binding that had to be replaced along the way. One line of evidence of the title and attribution seems to be the very worn label on the spine, “Plusieurs quernets et reconnoissances / Martin de Loes / 1377” (or Loys, or Loes altered to Loys), and an even more faded label attached inside the cover, which may say something like “Nobilium de Cossonay ... . repertor... par Mandrot, receu et stipulé année ? 1377 / ... Martin Loes.” If this reading is correct, the répertoires at the beginning and end might be ascribed to Amé (Aimé) Mandrot, who was responsible for a number of terriers around 1540. A somewhat different statement is found in text inserted on p. 82, at the end of the reconnaissance of Mermetus Grasset, dated 31 aug 1378, where the commissaire is listed as Martinus Quarterii de Loes, and the inserted text, mentioning applied seals, implies that the present volume is an unsigned register or protocol from which formal, signed copies were later made (viz., statements such as this at the ends of most of the reconnaissances, “fiant duo instrumenta, ad opus cuiuslibet parte unum” or similar).

The distinction between quernets and reconnaissances implicit in the label of the volume is apparently that “quernets” contain information about censiers who are subject to the noble reconnaissants, while ordinary “reconnaissances” concern properties held directly by the reconnaissants. Both types occur in this terrier.

The volume originally had foliation in Roman numerals (two sets), supplemented by Arabic page numbers likely no earlier than the 16<sup>th</sup> Century. The earliest foliation, located in the upper right corner of the rectos, as was typical for the times, begins on the first surviving folio with number x, indicating that at least nine folios have been lost, likely but not necessarily introductory material and perhaps also a repertorium. This foliation continues to the end of the text, originally numbered iii<sup>xxvii</sup>, which later became p. 155. The second foliation is centered in the top margin, beginning with i but continuing only to lxxiiii (p. 147, original folio number iii<sup>xxiii</sup>). The 16<sup>th</sup> Century pagination is likewise placed in the center of the top margin. In addition, most pages bear a new pagination in pencil in the upper outer margins, added by the ACV in preparation for the “digitization” project, and matching the 16<sup>th</sup> Century pagination.

There are three répertoires. The first, on the recto of the first extant folio, lacking folio or page number and lacking the texture of laid paper, and thus not part of the original volume, cites the 16<sup>th</sup> Century pagination, and is apparently in the same hand, suggesting that the pagination as well as the 16<sup>th</sup> Century répertoires were created by the same person and at the same time. The heading for the first répertoire is thus an indication of the nature and intent of the volume, as it was understood in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century: “Indice des noms et surnoms des recognoissantz mentionnez au present volume des recognoissances des fieds nobles de la baronnie de Cossonay stipullées en faveur de Noble Louys de Cossonay par Egrege Martin de Loes en l’année 1377 jusques à 1379.” The verso of this répertoire is blank, followed by another blank, unnumbered folio.

The second “repertorium”, in Latin, consists of two smaller inserted sheets of paper (lacking the obvious texture and watermarks of the main text), originally folded in half vertically, with two “titles”: on the left half of the recto of the first sheet (ACV page R1) that would have been the outer surface, “Liber ~~antiqui antiquissimi principium~~ libri a quo hec extractis sunt ita incipit” (and thus written long after Af 4 was created), and on the right half of this side, “Repertorium recognicionum existencium descriptis in libro feudorum nobilium Cossonay veteri”, again indicating that the original volume was already considered very old. The first entry on this repertorium also appears to reference the existence of the two foliations: “Nobilis Johannis de Disy militis apud Eschichens, apud Luxurye, Collombier, Aclens, foliis x (but then modified to <sub>p</sub>, thus changing decima, 10, to primo, 1, demonstrating that the scribe at the time, likely in the 15<sup>th</sup> Century, was aware of the two foliations, and chose to follow the second) et sequen[tibus]”. The other entries in this repertorium follow the same pattern, but many have additional marginal notations, such as “extrahatur” (=to be extracted), or “extractum est”, or the names of the later holders of the fiefs. This list was likely inserted at the beginning of the volume and only later bound with it. We surmise that this “repertorium” may be the work of the later commissaire Michel Quisard, possibly to be confirmed from his extant terriers from the end of the 15<sup>th</sup> Century.

The third répertoire, a sort of subject index, at the end, beginning with p. 157 (original foliation iii<sup>xxviii</sup>), and in the same hand, is labeled “Table des matieres contenues au present volume des recognoissances des fieds nobles de la baronnie de Cossonay stipullées en faveur de Noble Louys de Cossonay par Egrege Martin de Loes les années 1377, 1378, et 1379.” After this third répertoire (ending on p. 161, originally designated fol. iii<sup>xxix</sup>), there are several blank folios, which, however, continue the original foliation. The third répertoire was thus apparently inscribed on blank folios that were already present when the volume was created.

The name of the commissaire is first announced in the main part of the terrier (fol. 1) by a much later marginal notation (in French) as Martin de Loës. There is an original (1377-1379) notation on p. 151 (=original fol. 85), “Per Martinum de Loes notarium publicum et curie Lausanne juratum”, not necessarily a definitive statement that he was in fact the only commissaire involved in the preparation of this volume, but the statement on fol. 143, mentioned above, seems definitive. Also on p. 151, a further notation in the same hand, “Non est completa recognitio propter absenciam dicti Ludovici, et vide quis ipsorum fratrum tenetur ad homagium”, possibly referring to the incomplete reconnaissance that follows, but also possibly referring to the volume as a whole.

The main text, as well as the other pages that were part of the original volume, are written on laid paper. On some pages, there is a water mark of an anatomical heart, most clearly visible on pp. 17, 71, and 113.

There are at least three layers of marginal notations:

The earliest, contemporary with the preparation of the terrier itself, consists mainly of marks (including a highly stylized **¶**) that signal particular sections of the text, such as the names of censiers and other matters. These notations are in the left margins. Some of these are probably hidden in the binding. Also in the original hand are some insertions to the text.

The second layer consists of a small number of notations in Latin, mentioning later tenants of the fiefs, and in a couple places, also mentioning a commissaire Quisard (or possibly Guisard – the script is ambiguous) – very likely Michel Quisard, commissaire for a number of terriers around 1490, including some dealing with fiefs in the area around Cossonay.

The third layer is in the same 16<sup>th</sup> Century hand as the répertoires, presumably that of Amé Mandrot as suggested by one of the old volume labels, described above. The notations in this hand in the text are mainly labels intended for easy reference. They show the names of the reconnaissants, the names of many censiers, the placement of the date, if there is one, and other matters helpful to the interpretation of the text.

Af 4 is to be compared with Fg 3 ([Image group 101792835](#)), a very messy copy (“from an old book covered with black leather”, fol. 1) from the same source as Af 4. Although the inventory of the ACV indicates in the notes for Fg 3 that it is the volume described at some length by Louis de Charrière "Les fiefs nobles de la baronnie de Cossonay, étude féodale", *Mémoires et documents publiés par la Société d'histoire de la Suisse Romande*, première série, tome XV, Georges Bridel, Lausanne, 1858, pp. 846-850, the volume he used was in fact Af 4, as he cites a number of reconnaissances that did not find their way into the copy, Fg 3. De Charrière also noted the earlier reconnaissance of Girard de Mollens and Etienne de Mont son frère, p. 709 (see the last reconnaissance in the present volume, incomplete and problematic as to exactly how it should be interpreted). De Charrière refers to an inventory identified as *manuscrit Rebeur* (de Charrière indicated this manuscript was at the archives cantonales, and that fact implies that the author was the commissaire Pierre Rebeur, but the manuscript seems not to have been identified further), where that reconnaissance is described (as cited by de Charrière) as “Girardus de Mollens filius Johannis de Montibus recognovit esse hominem ligium precunctis dominis domini de Cossonay et possessiones infra Mollens recognovit ab ipso in manibus Girardi Bisuntii capellani de Cossonay, 30<sup>a</sup> decembris A<sup>o</sup> 1300”. Fg 3 also cites in the margins the folio numbers from the *second* foliation of Af 4 (except for the first reconnaissance, for which no folio reference is given, and for the last reconnaissance, which begins beyond the point where the *second* foliation of Af 4 ends, and thus its folio reference is from the *original* foliation), suggesting that Fg 3 was created by copying Af 4 before the 16<sup>th</sup> Century pagination was added, but after the removal of the first nine folios. Fg 3 contains only 14 reconnaissances (two not listed in its “repertorium huius extractus” but added later in pencil by the ACV, another missed entirely, and not all the folio numbers in that repertorium are correct), indicated below by the ‡ sign, and they are not in the same order as in Af 4. However, the reconnaissances that were

copied into Fg 3 match exactly the notations “extractum est” in the Latin repertorium of Af 4: The Latin repertorium was already in place when these 14 reconnaissances were copied into Fg 3, and that repertorium was annotated to note the progress of that project. Whether that copy was made by or for Michael Quisard is not known. The script in Fg 3 shows at least three different hands, and no additional notations. In fact, none of the mentions of Martinus de Loës in Af 4 were copied into Fg 3.



Page 1 (*original* folio number x) Introduction, stating that this volume contains reconnaissances for Nobilis et Potens Ludovicus dominus de Cossonay et de Suprapetram filius quondam Domini Johannis de Cossonay militis, dated 02 apr 1377 Style of the Nativity. The name of the commissaire is not included in this paragraph, but is listed in a 16<sup>th</sup> Century marginal notation in French, “Proheme de l’auteur, nommé Martin de Loes”.

The extract lacks a date, although de Charrière places it in December, 1300 (see above), and it is incomplete, ending on p. 155 (iiii<sup>xxvii</sup>) with a description of a property, and a 16<sup>th</sup> Century marginal notation, “La suite de la reconnaissance manque icy”. Nevertheless, the text mentions adjacent property holders, some in the vicinity of Ballens, Mollens, and Bière, that may be of interest. However, the text appears not to be a description of the situation in the time of Girardus de Mollens, but rather a list of the properties as they were held in 1377-1379, as may be seen at the beginning of this text:

Primo, dictus Johannes de Mollens quoddam pratum situm apud Biery dictum Pra Huber inter pratum abbacie Lacusjuriensis et les Communallies de Ballens... However, after listing many properties, p. 152, we find the following:

Item, confessus fuit esse de dicto feudo et homagio ligio etc. res infrascriptas quas tenet Stephanus de Montibus frater mei dicti Girardi, et que devenerunt ad partagium dicti Stephani. The description clearly comes from the time of Girardus de Mollens, rather than (his descendant) Johannes de Mollens, but without any statement that attention has shifted to Johannes de Mont. The statement thus appears anachronistic, apparently continuing a list of the properties held circa 1377-1379 by Johannes de Mollens.

On p. 153, another apparent anachronism, “Item, tenet de abbergamento Johannis filii Aymonis ou Debor dictus Stephanus res infrascriptas...” Further, there are occasional mentions of “dictus Johannes de Mont” in the property descriptions, as a holder of adjacent parcels.

On p. 155, another mention of Johannes de Mont: ... Debent pro aliquibus predictis quas nesciunt declarare domino priori Romanimonasterii xix denarios obolum ii rasas avene. Item, hospitali Albone septem rasas avene ii cupas frumenti, et asserunt tamen debere dicto Johannis de Mont x solidos Lausannenses, licet idem Johannes Dicat xv solidos. Item, xviii denarios Lausannenses quos debet annuatim Aymon.. (should be Aymo ?) de Leydeffour pro casali domus sue et ochia ibidem contigua sita juxta illos de Leydeffour a parte boree, et viam publicam tendentem versus Albonam... Then, after apparently completing the list of rights and properties that came from Girardus de Mollens, still on p. 155, “Item, tenet dictus Stephanus de dicto feudo in villa et territorio de Yens...”

In effect, it is impossible to verify from this text whether the names of the adjacent tenants are from the time of Girardus de Mollens (1300) or from 1377-1379. As a result, when

the text mentions a figure of interest, such as Cristinus Mayor de Ballens, known to have been living as late as 1380 (ACV Fh 101, at the bottom of fol. 72v, 15 may 1380), there is no way to integrate this information into a coherent timeline.
